UNA is proud to be selected for Magic Cabinet's multi-year Power Rural Building Cohort, joining five other rural-serving organizations in Washington. This investment strengthens grassroots leadership, community voice, and long-term, community-led solutions across the eight counties we serve. With this support, UNA will expand outreach, deepen partnerships, and advance health, equity, and belonging for immigrant, farmworker, and rural families. We are excited to collaborate toward a more equitable future where rural communities can thrive.



UNA received NCW Tech Alliance's Digital Access Microgrant to expand digital inclusion through mobile pop-up learning hubs in rural Central and North Central Washington. This support enables us to bring technology, connectivity, and digital skills training directly to underserved communities—especially farmworkers, seniors, and immigrant families. By reducing barriers to access and providing culturally relevant instruction, this project strengthens digital equity and supports education, health access, and everyday connection for rural families.



The amalgamated Foundation is supporting the expansion of RISE for Fair Pay, UNA's legal education and navigation program that empowers low-income, agricultural, and immigrant workers to understand their wage rights and report violations. This investment strengthens culturally responsive outreach and establishes an Emergency Organizing Hub—a rapid-response model led by farmworkers to address exploitation and drive collective action for fair pay and safe working conditions across Washington.



UNA received funding from the Community Health Partnership Fund to expand Community Conexión: Salud en Movimiento, a mobile health initiative delivering bilingual navigation and on-site screenings in Mattawa. Through promotora-led outreach and culturally responsive services, the program reduces barriers such as transportation, language, and insurance challenges—helping immigrant and underserved families connect to preventive care and essential resources. This partnership with Confluence Health and Wenatchee Valley Medical Group strengthens regional efforts to advance equitable healthcare access in rural Central Washington.



With OE13 Outreach Grant from Better Health Together UNA will expand community awareness and participation in Open Enrollment for health coverage across Adams County.



THIRD ANNUAL FIESTA DE SALUD

Fiesta de Salud (Health and Resources Fair) is a free community event designed to connect families with essential health services and community resources. The fair offers free medical screenings, healthcare information, and access to local organizations—all in a fun, welcoming, and pressure-free environment.

RISE RIGHTS, INCOME, SUPPORT, EMPOWERMENT

RISE for Fair Pay helps low-income, agricultural, and immigrant workers understand their wage rights and fight back against wage theft. Through culturally responsive workshops and one-on-one support, the program connects workers with trusted legal resources and empowers them to claim the pay and protections they deserve.



SHAP SUSTAINABLE HOME ACCESS PROGRAM

In November, the Sustainable Home Access Program (SHAP) helped with community past due utility bill. Utility assistance to eligible households, with one award per home. Approved funds are paid directly to the utility provider, and proof of payment was shared with recipients.

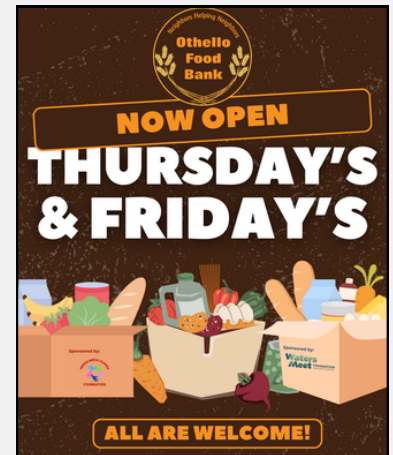
Legal Clinic
